The ethos of the English Department is to value each pupil as an individual. We endeavour to challenge, guide and support pupils to enable everyone to reach their full potential. We provide a structured and caring environment in which pupils learn to communicate effectively and successfully through the components of Reading, Writing, Talking and Listening. Pupils are encouraged to think independently and to develop their own personality by gaining confidence and exploring their creativity. We provide pupils with many opportunities to work with others, whether it's a group project, class discussion or drama performance.



Key Stage 3

In Years' 8, 9 and 10 all pupils are allocated at least six periods of English per week. A love of reading is also enhanced through a weekly visit to our fantastic living library. Pupils have the opportunity to explore a wide range of fiction and non-fiction texts that are relevant to their interests and life experiences. Pupils, through our varied schemes of work, are encouraged to develop creative, imaginative and critical thinking skills. Pupils will encounter a selection of popular literature texts in the form of novels, plays and poetry. The structure of lessons enables pupils to engage in a range of activities to enhance all aspects of communication, namely;

- Reading
- Writing
- Talking and Listening

There are multiple opportunities to work independently and with others in an interactive and fun learning environment, where discussion, debate and drama are common place.



Literacy Support

The English Department also works closely in conjunction with Learning Support to address individual pupil literacy needs. Various strategies are in place to raise pupil confidence and attainment, including a Reading Partnership Programme and after school Literacy Club. The Reading Partnership programme offers pupils, in the lowest streamed class, a weekly session of one to one reading support. This develops their confidence and enhances their basic reading skills, which benefits their studies across all strands of the curriculum. The emphasis of the Literacy Club is to facilitate pupil learning in an engaging, fun and interactive environment. The use of ICT, to enhance literacy skills encourages and benefits even the weakest students and the use of specifically chosen literacy games is also effective, as it provides pupils with the opportunity to work with others and to learn from their peers.



Key Stage 4

As we are all aware developing essential skills in English Language at G.C.S.E level is extremely important, as it enables young people to access a variety of educational and career pathways. At Key Stage 4 all pupils follow the G.C.S.E



course offered by CCEA for English Language whilst some pupils also study CCEA's English Literature course.
